

What is electrolysis?

The permanent removal of hair from the face or body using heat and/or chemical energy.


It's the ONLY FDA approved method for <u>permanent hair removal</u>. Existing hair will be destroyed forever once treatment plan is complete.

All other methods are only temporary.



There's a general rule of thumb. Then there are variables that impact the rule.

First you need to understand hair growth.

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Hair Growth – The General Rule of Thumb

All hair grows in waves Each hair within a wave goes through 3 main cycles GROW. REST. SHED. Multiple waves of hair are visible above the skin's surface at once, all in different cycles As hair sheds, it moves to the back of a long line of waves


Face & body hair take approx. 12-24 months to complete a full cycle.

More dense areas take longer to clear. A Full Beard & Bikini can take as long as three years.


> This is roughly how long your electrolysis treatment will last if you commit to your treatment plan.

Over time, appts get further apart, & sessions become shorter in duration

The Growth Phase is the most ideal phase for electrologists to target hair destruction



What Causes a Shift from the General Rule?



Hirsutism & Polycystic Ovarian Syndrome {PCOS}



HIRSUTISM: Terminal hair with male-patterned distribution in women

PCOS is the most common cause of hirsutism

Hirsutism affects 70% to 80% of those with PCOS


Insulin sensitivity/resistance cause the ovaries to overproduce the androgen hormone = hyperandrogenism

The androgen hormone is what triggers hair to grow on the body

Hyperandrogenism causes HIRSUTISM

Hirsutism & PCOS





Androgens travel to hair follicle through the blood.

Vellus hairs become terminal as an increased supply of androgens are pushed through the body.

Biological women's bodies do this "normally" during 3 major phases in their life: Puberty, Pregnancy & Menopause.

- "Abnormal" increases of androgens cause a greater number of vellus hairs to transition thus why those with PCOS are more prone to hirsutism.
 - Electrolysis can combat the effects of hirsutism by destroying the excess hairs permanently.

Without the help of medicine to regulate androgen production, new terminal hairs will keep forming making them difficult to manage with electrolysis alone. Once hair becomes terminal, the only way to get rid of it permanently is electrolysis, even after hormone levels return to "normal".



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A Side-by-Side Comparison



Most Precise		Е	-	Electrolysis removes one hair at a time targeting the hair beneath the skin. Laser scans a larger area attempting to impact several hairs at once.
Fastest Treatment Time	L		-	More hairs addressed at once so treatment time is significantly shorter.
Most Expensive	L			Laser treatments are a lifelong commitment. Payment for electrolysis will eventually come to an end.
Permanent Results		Ε	-	Electrolysis is the only permanent hair removal method. Laser can only deliver permanent reduction.
Greatest Risks & Limitations	L		-	Laser has the greatest risks like efficacy failures, skin burns & increased hair growth.
Works on all Skin Types		Ε	-	Laser doesn't work on all skin and hair types because it relies on a high background to foreground contrast. Laser cannot be performed on vitiligo impacted skin and does not work on blonde, red, grey nor white hair.
Works on all Hair Colors		Е	->	Even with the perfect foreground to background ratio, clients are still at risk of skin burns & increased hair growth.
Works on Tattoos		Ε	-	Laser cannot be performed over tattoos because there is not enough contrast, thus a risk of severe skin burns.
Can Increase Hair Growth	L		-	It's called Paradoxical Hypertrichosis. Laser light can trigger vellus hairs to transition into terminal hairs. This risk is even greater among those with androgen-related hormone imbalances.



Increase in hair density, color, or coarseness, or a combination of these at, or near treated sites.







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
